Grades 7 & 8

The 8th grade team is gearing up for a great end of the year. Students in Reading classes are finishing up the riveting Romeo and Juliet. Writing students are planning their own poetry slams in class, and students in 9th hour Robotics are programming and building exciting, playable arcade games. Theatre students are planning an improv variety show after wrapping up their biggest production of the year, the Lion King Jr., on May 5. The team looks forward to celebrating these amazing accomplishments with its students throughout the coming weeks.

Grades 9 & 10

Students across the ninth and tenth grade team are engaging in exciting and meaningful coursework! The student's Health Science class are earning their "white coats" by attending and graduating from medical school, participating in residencies where they are evaluating and diagnosing patients, and will be receiving their license to practice after passing their case presentation. PBS is designing experiments to study the effects on heart rate. Health and Wellness are finishing their land use project, and plan to present their findings to the school board on May 16. Algebra 1 is finishing their study of factoring, and are launching into their new focus of solving quadratic equations in a variety of ways. Students in Human Body System will also dive into the chemistry of muscle contractions, and will be applying their study through examining the physiology of an athlete's injury. In Biology, students will explore the evidence used to support the theory of evolution, create their own organism using the same process. English 9 is working on a short unit, along with independent reading and comprehension activities. The student will also be monitoring and setting goals to complete their reading and coursework within a specified timeframe. English 10 is working on
