What is Title I?



- Title I is a federal funded program supporting schools with high percentages of socioeconomically disadvantaged students. These funds are used to provide additional academic support and learning opportunities that ensure all students meet Indiana Academic Standards.

Schoolwide Designation

More than 50% of the students qualify for free and reduced lunch.

All students in the school are supported through the Title I programs that are offered in our building.

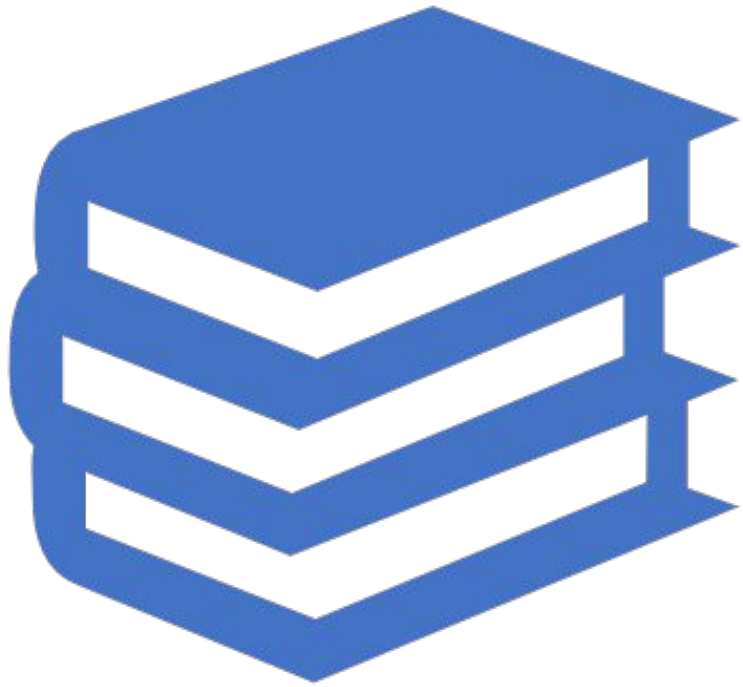


- To help measure student growth toward proficiency of grade level standards we use several different assessments.
